Cutting Instructions

Small

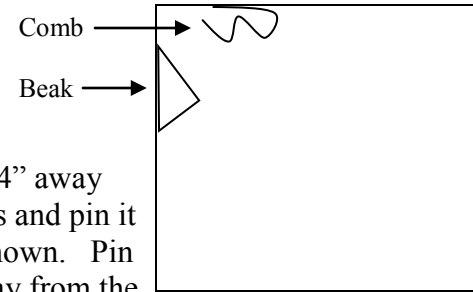
- Two 4" squares for body
- One 3 1/2" square for large tail
- One 3" square for small tail
- One 1 1/2" square for beak
- One 1 1/2" square for comb

Large

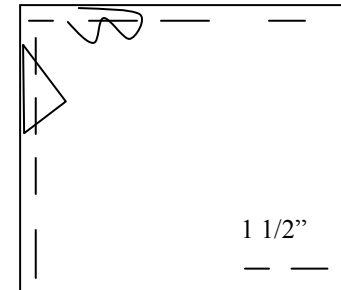
- Two 6 1/2" squares for body
- One 5 3/4" square for large tail
- One 4" square for small tail
- One 2" square for beak
- One 2" square for comb

Fold the beak piece diagonally twice and press.

Stick the beak piece 3/4" away from one of the corners and pin it INSIDE the seam as shown. Pin the comb part 3/4" away from the same corner to the opposite side.



Lay the two body squares right sides together. Sew a 1/4" seam on the same sides where the beak and comb are, making sure to backstitch. Sew a 1 1/2" seam as shown on the picture.



Fold both tail pieces diagonally and press. Pin the small tail on top of the large tail matching the raw edges and baste.

Take the one side that has not been sewn and match the two seams together in the middle. (This will look squished.) Insert the tails into this seam making sure the small piece is facing the comb. Sew seam. Turn right side out on the final open side.

Stuff the chicken with crushed walnut shells and slip stitch the seam closed.
